## AGREEMENT TO LICENCE CONDITIONS

In the matter of the review of the licence held by John Hayes, for Bamboogy, Yorkshire Street, Oldham, the premises licence holder requests the Licensing Authority to take note of the agreement reached with the applicant for review, the local weights and measures authority and the party making representations in the review, Greater Manchester Police, as follows:

1. That the applicant would voluntarily accept the following conditions be placed upon the licence for this premises:

***“The premises licence holder will risk assess in consultation with Greater Manchester Police the requirement for SIA registered door supervisors at the premises and use such door supervisors in such number and such times as deemed necessary by the risk assessment. Consultation does not confer a write of veto on Greater Manchester Police and the ultimate decision remains with the premises licence holder.***

***The premises licence holder will enter into and adhere with a drinks promotion protocol with Oldham Council Trading Standards. This protocol will set out how the premises licence holder will risk assess particular types of promotions if they are to be run at all and what measures it will take in light of the risk assessment in consultation with Oldham Council Trading Standards. Consultation does not confer the right of veto for Oldham Council Trading Standards and the ultimate decision rests with the premises licence holder”***

2. That, if accepted by the Licensing Authority, the local weights and measures authority would withdraw its proposed conditions contained within its application.

3. That, if accepted by the Licensing Authority, the Greater Manchester Police would withdraw its representations in relation to the review.
4. That, the parties to the proposed hearing in this matter having signed this agreement, requests the Licensing Authority to determine the application accordingly in accordance with Paragraph 7, Schedule 4 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
5. That, as agreement has been reached, the parties consider that a hearing is unnecessary and ask the Licensing Authority to proceed to determination in accordance with Regulation 9 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

The premises licence holder and the responsible bodies that are party to this review would like to take this opportunity to thank the Licensing Authority for their determination in this matter.

## **BAMBOOGY OLDHAM**

### **PROMOTIONS PROTOCOL**

The operators of Bamboogy Oldham are committed to providing a venue which operates with the highest standards providing a safe night out for customers and complying with the licensing objectives in the Licensing Act 2003.

For the purpose of this document regulated drink promotions are classed as the following;

- 1 Offers to supply alcohol for less than 75p per unit of alcohol or
- 2 Offers to supply alcohol for the payment of a fixed fee or "all inclusive" or;
- 3 Offers to supply alcohol where the purchase of one drink results in the supply of a free drink or drinks or;
- 4 Offers to supply alcohol in return for tickets or vouchers purchased on the premises or;
- 5 Offers which are a discount to purchasers of alcohol exceeding 20% either through promotion voucher published in advance or ticket/voucher purchased on the premises.

Prior to any regulated drinks promotion the risk assessment will address amongst other things;

- 1 Polycarbonate Glasses

- 1.1 The risk assessment will include whether drinks (apart from champagne) need to be dispensed into polycarbonate glasses.

- 2 STAFF TRAINING

- 2.1 The risk assessment will assess and ensure that staff are fully trained with regard to the responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 and in particular that intoxicated customers are not admitted to the premises by the door staff and bar staff and if within the premises are refused service.

### 3 QUANTITY of DRINKS

3.1 The risk assessment will include whether or not a limit should be placed on the number of drinks that can be sold in each transaction.

### 4 SEARCH POLICY

4.1 The risk assessment will include whether there should be a search policy and whether persons who do not agree to be searched should be refused entrance to the venue.

### 5 CCTV

5.1 The risk assessment will include whether the CCTV at the premises is sufficient.

### 6 OPERATIONAL MEASURES

6.1 The risk assessment would include ensuring that customers using the dance floor and the facilities in general are safe.
